Annual Reorganization Meeting, FY 2018-2019

1. Call to Order for the Technical Committee

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Mike Fleming at 9:05 a.m.

Chairman Fleming called for the nominations for the Chairman and Secretary of the YAMPO Technical Committee for FY2018-2019. Ron Miller made a motion to re-nominate Mike Fleming and Felicia Dell as Chairman and Secretary, respectively, for FY2018-2019. The motion was seconded by Dwight Huntington with no discussion. Motion Carried.

YAMPO Technical Committee Meeting

1. Call to Order for the Technical Committee

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Mike Fleming at 9:10 a.m.

4. Minutes.

A. Minutes of the April 5, 2018 Technical Committee Meeting

A motion to approve the Minutes of the April 5, 2018 Technical Committee Meeting was made by Ron Miller and seconded by Larry Smith with no discussion. Motion carried.

B. Summary of the June 7, 2018 Technical Committee Meeting

Will Clark informed the Committee members that the June 7th Technical Committee meeting was held as a public open house for the 2019-2022 YAMPO TIP. No formal action was taken during the meeting, so only a brief summary is being provided. Hence, no Committee action is required on this summary.

C. Review of the June 28, 2018 YAMPO Coordinating Committee Meeting Minutes

- Committee approval of the 2019-2022 TIP and Air Quality Resolution
- Committee approval of ARLE applications; two application submitted to PennDOT around July 6th.

5. Announcements

A. I-83 Exits 24-28 Study - Will Clark

PennDOT held an ICC meeting for this project on June 26th. The Department will finalize the study report for this project in August 2018. A process of implementation will be developed. The YAMPO will develop the proposed project implementation plan.

B. Candidate Projects Consultant Work/Seaks Run Road/Susquehanna Trail Intersection - Beth Nidam

The Department approved the project for LPN assistance. The first stakeholders work session will be held in late August.

C. U. S. Route 15 Reconstruction - Will Clark

This Project is on the TIP. The Project extends from Range End Road to the Cumberland County Line. The original concrete surface will be removed and replaced with a new bituminous wearing course. The road must be widened for additional travel lanes during construction. A stakeholder meeting was held Tuesday, July 31st to review this process. The concept of limited access along this corridor segment was discussed.

D. South George Street/Rathton Road/Country Club Road Improvements – Will Clark

Project is scheduled for bid letting on September 13, 2018. The project includes double left turn lanes for South George Street (south approach) and Rathton Road. Dual receiving lanes are also proposed for Country Club Road.

A question was raised about the roundabout proposal for the York College entrance. This improvement was addressed in the initial transportation planning study conducted for the Rathton Road/Country Club Road corridor. As result of negotiations with the College and Spring Garden Township, it was determined neither a roundabout nor traffic signal would be considered here.

Joe Stafford inquired whether the bridge on Country Club Road near South George Street will be widened, as well. Mr. Clark stated that it would be.

A discussion ensued about the York College's purchase of properties along South George Street.

E. Regional Environmental Justice (EJ) Benefits and Burdens Report – Will Clark, YCPC

A stakeholder meeting for all the MPO's in District 8-0 was held with the Rutgers consulting team on July 12th. The Rutgers team plans to wrap up this report in September. One product of this study is to identify the number of census blocks with EJ populations affected by each TIP Project in order to identify the specific number of affected persons in each census block.

6. Committee Reports

A. 2019 Long Range Transportation Plan Committee - Will Clark, YCPC

The LRTP Steering Committee met on July 27th to review the performance measures developed by each working group. The working groups will now meet in early fall 2018 to develop targets for

the performance measures. The steering committee will meet in late fall 2018 to review the working group targets. The LRTP development activities can be found at the following web address: www.GoYork2045.com.

8. New Business

a. 2017 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Actions - Adam Grimes, PennDOT

- i) Highway and Bridge Administration Modifications, April - June, 2018
- ii) Highway and Bridge Administration Modifications, June - August, 2018

Mr. Grimes reviewed the Highway and Bridge Administrative Modifications for the 2017 YAMPO TIP.

b. 2018 Interstate 83 Traffic and Conditions (TAC) Report - Jesse King, YCPC

Mr. King reviewed with the Committee the changes for this edition of the TAC Report, including the addition of Average Daily Truck Traffic (ADTT) volumes and changes in definitions of crash injuries. He then presented a PennDOT video about the Yellow Phase addition to new traffic signals and a YCPC video featuring the TAC Report.

The Committee members had the following comments about the TAC video:

- Remove the shots of the I-83 corridor; video shows only poor roadway conditions for I-83;
- Videos of segments of the corridor could be downloaded on the YCPC Website;
- Peak the public interest by cutting down on the narration;
- Make the video more generic and update the Report slides annually.

c. 2018 Annual Pavement and Bridge Conditions Report - Jesse King, YCPC

Mr. King stated that the report contents have been changed to conform to the PPN Network. He then reviewed the contents of the report. He stated that the Performance Measures for Interstate highways and roadways less than 2000 ADT did not meet performance targets for 2017.

Mr. Fleming commented that the local road data has moved to weight limits due to inspection regulation changes for all local bridges.

d. 2018 Safety Project Evaluations - Jesse King, YCPC

Mr. King reviewed the report with the Committee. He stated that the reports documents a critical evaluation of safety improvements. A 5-year traffic safety trend scenario was employed to rate these improvements.

He highlighted the following four intersections evaluated through this process:

- PA Route 462/Locust Grove Road/Pleasant Acres Road, Springettsbury Township
- Market Street and Harrison Street, City of York
- Freysville Road and Windsor Road, Windsor Township
- U.S. Route 30 and Roosevelt Avenue, City of York and West Manchester Township.

He stated that the intersections evaluated in this report were rated in the following manner:

- Total Crashes
- Crash Rate
- Total estimated cost of crashes.

Only the Locust Grove Road/Pleasant Acres Road improvement showed a decrease in the three factors listed above. The U. S. Route 30/Roosevelt Avenue intersection experienced a decrease in total estimated cost of crashes. The factors for all other intersections increased. Mr. King stated that though three intersections experienced a crash rate increase, the rate is still well below the statewide average.

9. Other Business

a. 102-Inch Truck Trailer Legislation - Will Clark, YCPC

Mr. Clark stated that Senate Bill 880 will be enacted on December 10, 2018. No trucks will be prohibited from travel on any public road in the state, unless a municipality conducts a Traffic and Engineering (T and E) Study which prohibits such access.

b. Senior Housing Initiatives – Felicia Dell, YCPC

Ms. Dell stated that recent changes have been made to municipal zoning ordinances allowing other housing types, such as senior housing, in residential neighborhoods. Affordable housing options through developer tax credits and subsidies are being explored for seniors presently. This issue will be addressed through a stakeholder meeting to be held this fall.

c. York County Storm water Authority - Felicia Dell, YCPC

Ms. Dell stated that a cost-effective way to meet water quality standards on a county-wide basis is to form a County Storm Water Authority. She stated that the YCPC has engaged consultant teams to develop a business plan; identify technical services; and provide legal support for the Authority. Fee structures will be reviewed in August. Legal issues of establishing an Authority will be addressed in September. Two public meetings will be held on September 25th and November 8th.

d. 2018 DCED Multimodal Transportation Fund (MTF) Program - Will Clark, YCPC

Mr. Clark stated the DCED received the following three project applications for the 2018 MTF Program:

- Duke Street, Penn Street and Pershing Avenue improvements, York City
- New View Development at I-83, Exit 39, Fairview Township
- Downtown Streetscape Project, Hanover Borough.
